While driving to our Car Show, Cecil Bozarth's Lincoln Zephyr lost power. He speculated the dual coil was bad, leaving him running on six of the V12's cylinders. Cecil plotted a slow route home to Chapel Hill. He sent the following message. "Got home fine, though I burned *a lot* of gas (half of it really just blowing through the six missing cylinders). Today, I went out, started it up and all cylinders were hitting. So I am almost positive it is a bad coil (in theory, one of the two rotors in the distributor could be bad as well, but this is unlikely). The reason I can't use any old 6-volt coil is because the coil unit is integral to the distributor. Fortunately, I have back-up and the swap is not all that hard."

Don Aikin asked me to insert the following in the newsletter. "I have 3 trophies not picked up Saturday. One is for Cecil Bozarth.
