Triangle Chapter Meeting Notes - 5/18/2013

- 1. There were 33 members present. Denny reported that Tony Hantjis is feeling much better after his big surgery. He even talked to Denny on the phone. Denny also reported that Jack and Alice Johnson lost their son in law last week. Our hearts reach out to Jack and Alice.
- 2. Fred Harley was out of town and so there was no membership or treasurers report.
- 3. Chapter Car Show reports—Mary Gage stated there were 59 cars registered and 52 on the field. Joe Parsons reported we had 17 Sponsors and collected \$3000. We also received \$154 from the raffle. Riley finished all the sponsor trophies. Dan Fuccella led nine youth participate in the youth judging program. Jean Soehnlein reported that the Eastern Star sold all their food. A big thank you goes out to all who helped make our show a real success.

Pinehurst Concours—13 cars from 12 Chapter families were part of the Inaugural Pinehurst Concours d"Elegance and many won awards. The winners are in the newsletter. Denny proposed that we consider changing our car show date from the first Saturday in May to the last Saturday in April due to the conflict with the Concours, the Wake Forest Show and a Horseless Carriage tour on our current date. Members voted to change the date. Oakview Historic Park can let us have the April date.

Region Board Meeting—Jack Agayoff and Denny Oestreich attended the Meeting. 64 cars were at

the Region Meet. The Status of the Scholarship Program is unchanged. No Scholarship funds have been disbursed. The membership is down slightly. The plans are to continue holding the annual Region Meeting in Burlington. Jack is trying to get a three year commitment from the hotel.

Discussion:

Denny made a proposal (subject to Chapter approval) that the Triangle Chapter would hold a Region Meet and a Chapter meet at the same time and on the same location. (Alamance has held dual meets for some time.) The reason for a dual meet is that a Region Meet can only be attended by AACA Members and registration must be a week or more in advance. We have many cars that come to our meet that are not owned by AACA Members (Denny said there were 15 at our recent meet.) We could expand the Chapter meet to include some modified cars. Jack Agayoff suggested we hold a non Region dual meet next year to see how it would go and work out any problems with dual shows. After much discussion, it was decided that the Chapter Board would discuss the dual meet concept over the summer and bring a plan to the members at the September meeting.

Denny has had requests for cars to participate in the Durham Museum Parade in October, the Bureau of Medical Data 100th Birthday celebration and many ongoing requests for weddings and other events. None of these requests are going to be a club participation, but if you have an interest in any of these events, contact Denny.

Cary and Wake Forest Car Shows By Denny Oestreich

The Triangle Chapter displayed cars and provided Take-A-Part T demonstrations at two local car shows this spring. On May 18, the city of Cary held their second annual "Wheels on Academy" car show in downtown Cary. The town cleared Academy Street for car show parking, provided a band for entertainment and invited Barney Fife from Mayberry to safeguard the cars. Our chapter performed two Take-A-Part T demonstrations and several members helped with car judging.

Ten Triangle members met early in a nearby school parking lot and drove in together. After parking on the street, the cars were wiped down and readied for judging. **Dan Morton** towed the Take-A-Part T to the display area near the bandstand. We disassembled the T and got ready for the morning demonstration.

Twelve Triangle Chapter members were on hand to serve as the assembly team. With Riley Reiner on vacation, **Jack Agayoff** stepped into the role of assembly line foreman in the borrowed Ford coat. Jack provided narration for the public and directions for the assembly team. Dan Morton was "electric" as the new starter. **Bob Gault** (pictured below) was the designated T driver for the demonstrations.



The first demonstration took over eight minutes because the throttle linkage was not connected and some diagnostic time was required. The afternoon show was better at less than seven minutes.



The Barber Vintage Motorsports Museum By Rob VanDewoestine

The Barber Vintage Motorsports Museum is

located just outside Birmingham, Alabama. It was built by George Barber who started a dairy in the Birmingham area in the 1930's. His company grew by acquiring dozens of other dairies in the 1940's, 50's and 60's. He became interested in motorcycles and racing in the 1960's and started collecting them as well. He had a motorcycle museum in Birmingham but about 10 years ago built the current museum and racetrack. He has never married and has no children so a lot of energy went into the museum. It sits on 750 acres and cost \$80 million. The main structure housing the collection and restoration shops (as well as some interesting sculpture) is shown on the next page..

There are approximately 1200 motorcycles in the collection with about half of them on display at any time. The building has several different levels served by a very large elevator with bikes and race cars in about every place imaginable.



The restoration area was located on the lowest level and visible for visitors. It was absolutely organized and immaculate.



There is a two mile road course on the property that is used for a wide variety of racing and training events. The museum building can be seen in the lower right of the track layout picture.



This museum is paradise for motorcycle and race car fans and good fun for the rest of us. The only downside of a visit is that our own shops look rather shabby when we get home.
