### Meeting Minutes continued

- The open newsletter editor position will be temporarily filled by Denny Oestreich and Jean Soehnlein. Some months will be e-mail only in the interim. If you have, or can write up any articles for the newsletter, they would be appreciated. And if you are interested in helping with the newsletter, let Riley know.
- Fred Harley reported that membership is at 85 families and the treasury is in great shape at \$6,700 (prior to show income and expenses).
- 4. Upcoming shows to consider include: (more details in the newsletter)
  - a.May 9 Garden Club show in Wake Forest. Dean Tryon is the contact.
  - b.May 16 Cary show. Help with the "T" is needed but we have no judging responsibility this year.
  - c.May 30 NC Region meet in Wilmington at the battleship museum site.
  - d.June 20 Wake Forest Charity Car show in downtown. Last year they had 236 cars and closed all of downtown for it. We will do the "T" at 11 & 1.
- 5. Denny reminded/requested members to support our nearby chapters car shows also.
- 6. Riley and Marv reviewed the status of our 4/18 show. Results will be in the next newsletter.
- 7. Several member received awards at the Charlotte show earlier this month including Fred Harley, Joe Parsons and Dan Fuccella.
- 8. The discussion on non-ethanol fuel that started at our January meeting resulted in Dean putting together a chart of 31 local stations. This was distributed by e-mail to all chapter members recently.

The program was a very interesting 20 min movie (plus two short humorous commercials for the Opel Kadette) by Skip Elsheimer (see www.avgeeks.com).

He has a huge collection of 16mm films from the 1950's and older. The one he showed was "The Changing Architecture of The Automobile Body", a GM production showing the changing of early body style of cars, sport cars and special bodies.



### 2015 Triangle Chapter Car Show April 18, 2015 by Denny Oestreich

We worried about the success of our show because of competing shows and a light rain in the morning. However, when the rain stopped at about 9 am and the cars started coming to registration, we were on the way to a successful show. In total we had 62 cars on the show field. Thanks to our members' hard work the show went very well. The participants and spectators enjoyed themselves.

Planning for our car show started in October of 2014 with the reservation of a date for the show with



the NC Region. We had to carefully choose a date that did not conflict with other car shows. We moved the date one week earlier, to April 25, so we would not conflict with the Pinehurst Concours. Then we moved the date another week earlier, to April 18, so that we did not conflict with the Corvette show as we did last

vear. We were still impacted the big bv Good Guvs Hot Rod show at the State Fair grounds. Several entrants chose our show because it was lower cost.



Also, it rained on April 25, so it seems we may have picked the best date we could this year.

Marv Gage coordinated our car show arrangements with Oak View, planned the advertising and the parking. The newspaper advertising in the N&O proved to be very effective for drawing nonmembers and spectators.

Registration was coordinated by Dean Tryon. Dean had 38 preregistrations including many that came in at our last meeting two days before the show. We had only six no-shows. The remaining 30 registrations came the day of the show.

The field layout and preparation were done on Friday before the show. Tony and Arlene Hanjis provided the cones, markers, and signs which they

have donated to the Triangle Chapter. Thank you, Tony and Arlene. The field layout was completed bv the team of Triangle members. The tent was put up, 22 sponsor ban-



ners were placed on the gazebo, and signs placed around the area. Thanks to Dan Morton for doing the heavy hauling of the car show materials. Thanks also to Joe Parsons for soliciting the sponsorships and preparing the banners. Riley and Sandra transported the Take-a-Part T.
