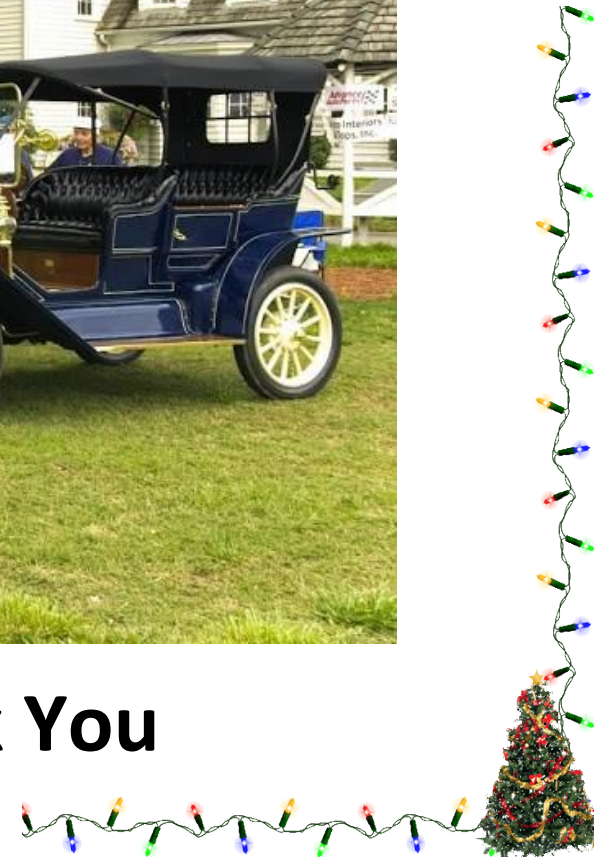


A: A 1909 White Steamer, ordered by President Taft.

Q4: True or False? The 1953 Corvette came in white, red and black.

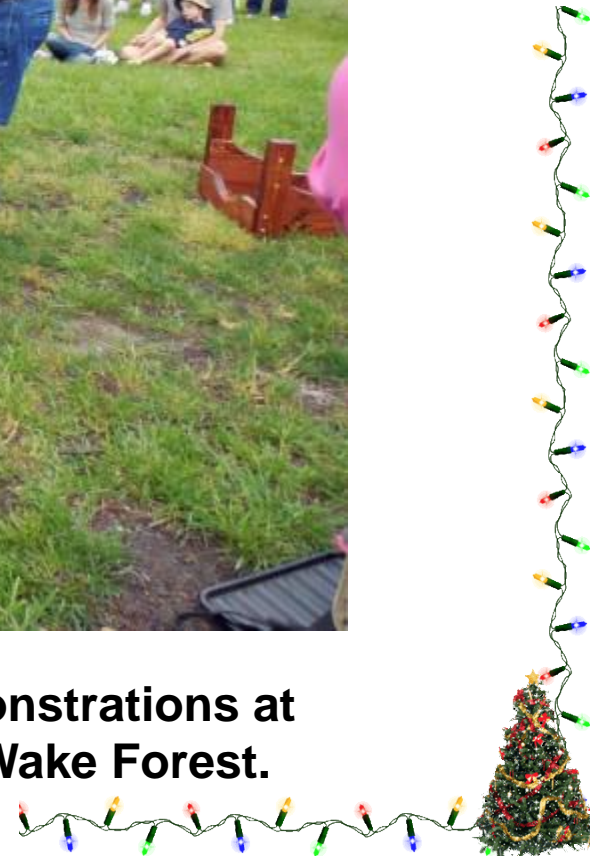


A: False. The 1953 'Vet's were available in one color, Polo White.

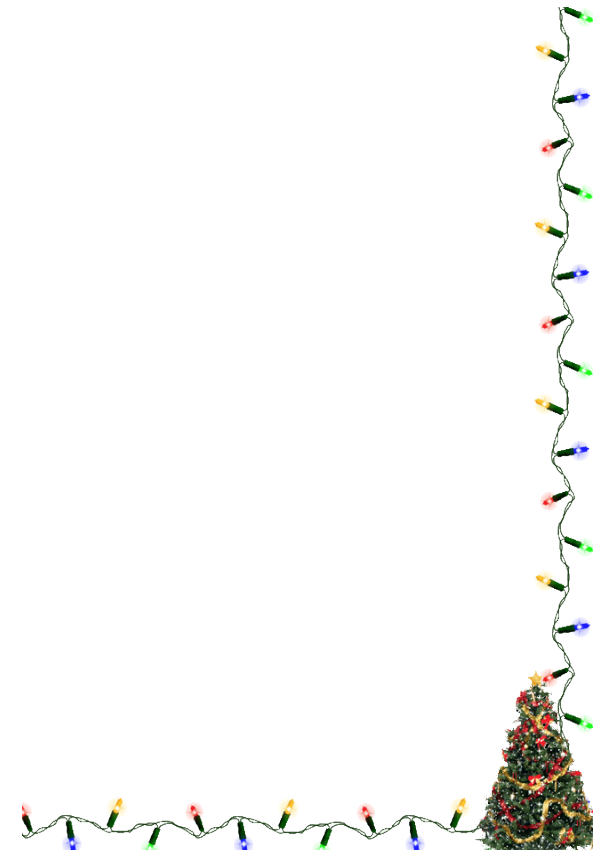

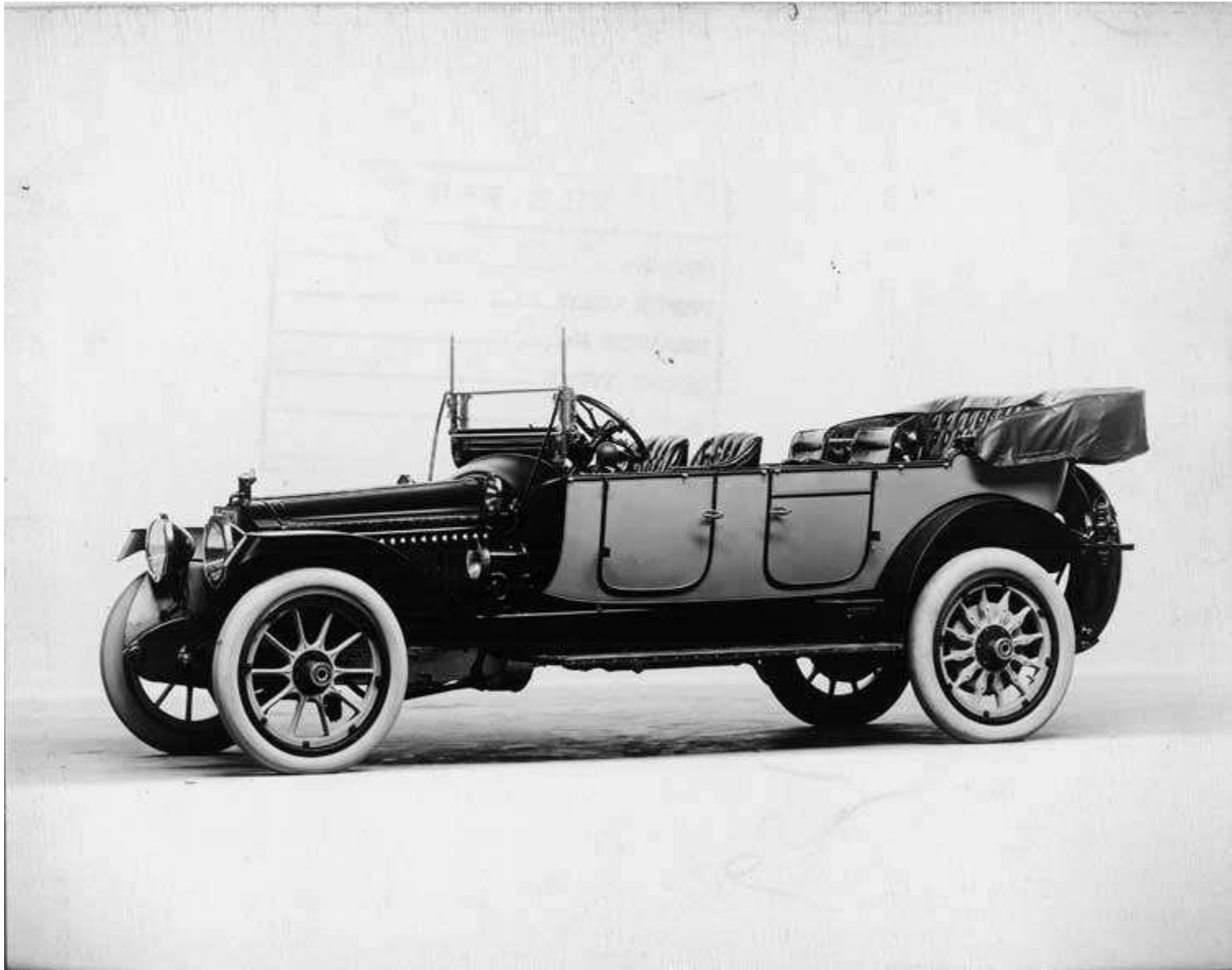

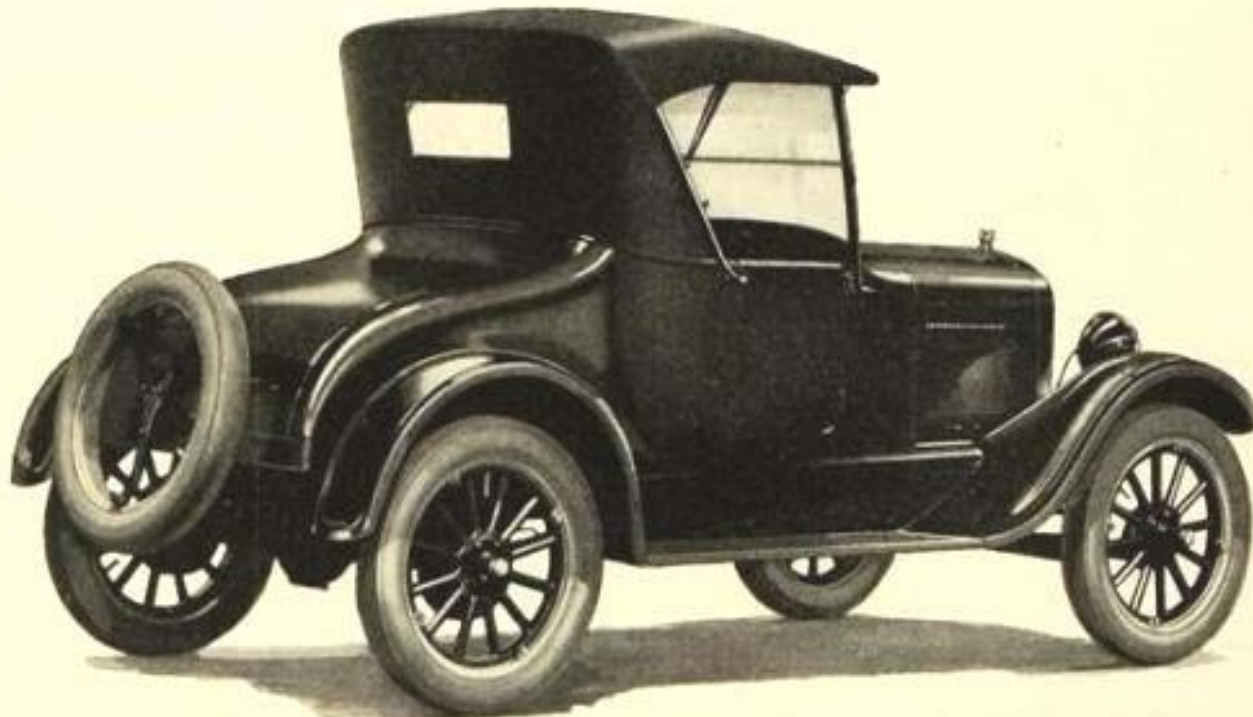
