9. 1949 Desoto Woody For Sale

Still time for a big red bow all ready for your pick-up of with this 1949 DeSoto Woodie Wagon. Only 850 built in 1949. According to a study of available records only 8 still exist world-wide. It's unique. This Desoto has just undergone a tune-up, new brakes and new Coker Classic wide-whites (& much more) to give you that smooth, Richie Cunningham of "Happy Days" attack from the traffic light, ride. A DeSoto, Richie's dad, Mr. C's favorite choice in wheels. Andy Trexler of Raleigh's AVEC Auto Services on Triangle Drive has done a terrific job in preparing this beauty for the road.

The body style is a Deluxe Suburban Station Wagon. It is a nine, that is, a 9 passenger ride, so it's able to accommodate eight grandchildren and a grey or bald headed driver. The ride is powered with a 236 Cu In inline L-Head, 112 HP 6 cylinder engine. It has a 3 speed **Fluid Drive** transmission, radio, heater, and clock. It makes itself known with a 125.5" wheel-base and a weight of 3,895 lbs. I have owned this beauty since 1973. It has been well cared for and always under cover.

Fluid Drive is the trademark name that Chrysler Corporation assigned to a transmission driveline combination offered from 1939 through 1953 in Chryslers and from 1940 through 1953 in DeSotos. It is comprised of a power coupling for

permitting a smooth start in any gear. It consists of two vanned rotors in a sealed casing filled with oil, where one rotor, driven by the engine, moves the oil to drive the other rotor, which in turn drives the transmission.

Here is a special bonus that has made itself available for Thursday, March 23, 2017, the first day of the AACA National Meet in Palm Springs, CA. You can reserve a 1-hour scenic ride on the Flabob Express, a vintage 1940's DC-3. The airplane, normally based in Riverside at Flabob airport, will be in Palm Springs that day. If there are 8 people signed up, the per-person cost of the ride is \$250.00. If there are 16 people signed up, the per-person cost of the ride is \$125.00. Proceeds from the flight will benefit "The Tom Wathan Center at Historic Flabob Airport", a 501-C-3 non-profit charity. There are currently 7 people signed up, and the organizer, Mike Petersen (dodgecity@nc.rr.com; 919-851-

<u>6726</u>), will be finalizing the tour group in the next week or so; so act fast if you want to experience a bit of aviation history and help a good nonprofit. Note that this flight is not associated with AACA. If a person commits and pays for a ride and later cancels, and a replacement rider is not found, the fee is forfeited. If the flight is unable to be conducted (i.e, weather restrictions, for example), the fee is refunded.
