A major hint to solving the tool challenge is to think about who submitted the challenge. What kind of cars do they restore. What do they like?

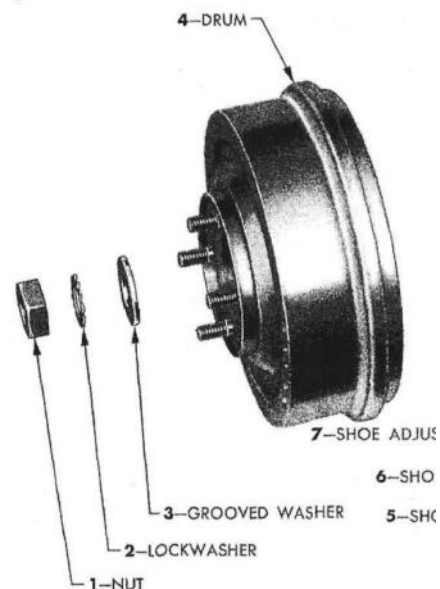
### May Tool Challenge



There were no correct guesses to the May Tool Challenge. Ted Brooks said, “No, this is not the base of a Lunar Landing Module.:) Yes, it’s an ordinary puller with 3 bolts attached. Note the notches cut into the heads of the bolts.” Sometimes you need to improvise. The tool is Ted’s Improved version of a Clutch Spring Compressor for a Chevrolet Powerglide Transmission. tool #5133. He used this tool to repair the powerglide on his 1957 Chevrolet. I have rebuilt and power glide transmission and I know this tool would be useful.

## 15. Willys Jeep Trek (On the Road Again)

Dan and Jean Fuccella are on another of their famous Jeep trips and have been providing a blog of their activities. Several of us who receive their blog are very interested trips vicariously enjoying the journeys. Their latest journey is titled "2017 Trek to West Virginia, Ohio, and Michigan".

Dan's preparation for this trip included *"This trip's preparations: Replace 6 volt battery, clean and set ignition points, check timing, gap and replace spark plugs, change oil and filter, grease and lube chassis and drivetrain, adjust voltage regulator. Since the western USA trek we have replaced all of the electrical wiring, rebuilt the braking system and fitted the Jeep with a dual brake master cylinder."*



Dan Says, "One must-do stop on the way to Ann Arbor was the "OVERLAND" smokestack at the site of the original Jeep manufacturing plant in Toledo, OH. The smokestack (one of 3 originally standing) is virtually the only remaining artifact of the location where our Jeep was manufactured in 1950."

A typical days' travel and touring is summed up in this quote for their latest blog, "The trip through south-central Michigan and north-western Ohio was mostly over straight and flat roads through rural farmland. It timed out nicely that we crossed Ohio's Maumee River at lunch time where we had our traditional picnic of (you guessed it) peanut butter and honey sandwiches on multi-grain bread at the city park in Grand Rapids, OH."
