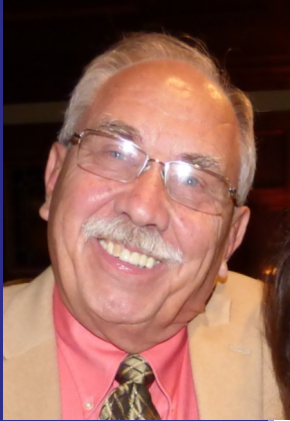

Carl Worstell's Sweet White Bean Chili

1 lb. ground beef, browned and drained
 1 lb. ground turkey, browned and drained
 3 bell peppers, chopped (I use blender to chop)
 2 onions, chopped (I use blender to chop)
 4 cloves garlic, minced
 2 14 ½-oz. cans vegetable broth
 1 15 oz. can butter beans, rinsed and drained
 1 15 oz. can garbanzo beans, rinsed and drained
 1 15 oz. can black-eyed peas, rinsed and drained
 1 15 oz. great northern beans, rinsed and drained
 1 4 oz. can chopped green chilies
 2 Tbsp. chili powder
 1 cup ketchup
 1/3 cup honey
 3 tsp ground cumin
 2 tsp. dried oregano
 2 tsp. paprika
 2 tsp. salt
 ½ tsp. pepper

Combine all ingredients in slow cooker, cover and cook on low 10 hours.
