Mike Petersen of the Triangle Chapter attended representing AACA as a National Awards Judge. Mike looked at several vehicles for AACA National Awards. He was called on to help classify a special 1976 Cadillac Mirage pickup. The Mirage was a special vehicle which Wiki describes as follows: "From 1975 to 1976 small numbers of Coupe de Villes were converted into car-based pick-ups, similar to a Chevrolet El Camino, but much more upscale. Coachbuilding company Traditional Coach Works manufactured 204 of these, called the **Cadillac Mirage**, to Cadillac's standards, such that one could be ordered through a participating



Cadillac dealer. The floor bed could carry flat plywood 4 x 8 sheets with the tailgate closed, while the two-seat front cabin offered driver and passenger a plush ride. A storage area behind the seats was used for golf-clubs or small

articles of value, out of view. A metal cover with a lock on it was available for the rear bed, just as a trunk would also have."

For this concours more than 30 Penske vehicles were displayed in four different classes. Cars of Penske was comprised of vehicles that Roger raced himself. In 1966, Penske founded Roger Penske Racing, which later became Team Penske. The three classes representing this era included Team Penske, Team Penske Sunoco and Penske Indy Winners.
