

As you might of guessed it Dan's car in the first in the 2024 Monthly series.

Dan's first car was a **1946 Ford Business Coupe** purchased in 1957 by his father.

Proudly Dan, rebuilt its flathead V8 the same year, complete with mounted finned aluminum heads and twin carbs.

A two dollar bill and a Hot Rod Ford, there's dancin' right over the hill!

Flatheads forever!

The customization continued with some early "rat" rodding with a retrofitted Chevy grill.

This led to his next six cars all Chevy's—'55 to '65 with small-block Chevy V8's.

Some fun facts:



1946 considered a post war production model year was largely designed off the 1942 model.

There we 163,370 Super Deluxe Tudor Sedan made to satisfy American's desire to travel after coming home from war. This same model went for \$1185.00, I'm going guess Dan's dad paid about \$200 in '57.

The 1946 Flathead V8 was 239ci and widely disputed as one of the best motor's Ford put out to.

100 hp at 3800 rpm with Holley 94 two-

barrel carburetor. Also came in 226Ci 6 cylinder.

This month is Safety First month!

We can all use a little help around the garage or shop!

Send me those tips or questions

Chemicals are chemicals. Even in storage, harsh chemicals are just waiting to cause problems. It's best to store flammable, toxic, and downright nasty products where they can't do any harm. Chemical storage sheds are a thing. Invest in one.

Don't overload your shelving. It's easy to forget that shelving systems have weight limits. Be sure to keep that in mind while you fill them up. If you neglect this, you'll either wind up with a major mess or flatter than a pancake when that thing comes down.

Keep heavier parts closer to the ground. Don't put your cylinder heads on the top shelf unless you want to send your spine through the concrete. Keeping all heavy things on the ground level might not be convenient, but it'll keep visits to the chiropractor at a minimum.

Point the pointy bits away. As you organize tools, materials, and whatever else is in your shop, keep the sharp end tucked away. Trust me. Your screwdrivers and bits of sheet metal are dying to take a bite.

all down & give that shop vac a whirl
