Our chapter hosted its annual car show on April 30, 2022 at the Wake Tech Community College which opened the Hendrick Center for Automotive Excellence/ Hendrick Automotive Group. It is huge educational center for mechanical and body shop education at this location.

One of our clubs' high lights each show is the Hagerty youth judging where children have an opportunity to judge 3 cars with an expert judge.

Mike Petersen is the instructor for the youth judging. He has 361 AACA National credits and has judged at every AACA National in 34 states. In his 32 years with the AACA he has attended 9 of all AACA Nationals. Mike is Chairman of the Specified Class Committee and a member of the Judging Committee, National Awards Committee, and the Class Acceptance Committee.



The youth judges enjoy giving the car owners their award ribbons for first, second and third.






